

Dear Parents.

If you're reading this, it's probably because you're interested in helping your child develop his writing skills. Hooray for you!!! The more your child writes, the better his writing will be. Practice always makes things better.

This booklet is designed for children ranging in age from six to twelve. We have created 10 fun and engaging prompts to inspire astonishing writing. You can use this booklet any way you would like. Here are some ideas:

- Have your child work through the booklet, completing one writing prompt each week. At the end, he will have a nice summer journal with 10 entries that you can keep.
- Choose a certain number of prompts you would like your child to have completed by the end of the summer, for example, 5. Let him skip around and choose the prompts he would like to complete.
- If your little writer is reluctant, talk with him about the prompt for the day. Make it fun, and break the writing process up into multiple days! On day one, have your child brainstorm ideas he could write about. On day two, have him plan out what he wants to write, and on day three, write the final copy. Support him, encourage him to explore his ideas, and praise his effort. You can even give a fun reward for each completed prompt (stickers, smiley faces, etc.). Each time he earns five stickers or smiley faces, he get a beloved treat --ice cream, money, extra screen time--whatever works to motivate your child.
- Create a schedule for your child to ensure the writing gets completed, and remember to make it
 fun! Maybe it's something you do after breakfast or after dinner as part of your routine. Praise and
 reward your child for the effort put into his writing. This isn't the time for criticism.
- You can use this as a teaching tool as well. For example, if you see that your child never starts a
 sentence with a capital letter or does not use correct subject-verb agreement, you can teach these
 skills on the side, but separately from their prompts. Please don't take out a red pen and destroy
 his writing. Just file away the knowledge and address it at another time.





A publishing company has asked you to provide a review of a new book. You've read it and are ready to share your thoughts. This can be completely made up or can be based on a book you've read!






